## Choose a Sliding Door or Panel Only

Skip the swing door if you're tight on space.

Sliding: Great for narrow rooms—no clearance needed.

Fixed panel (walk-in): Clean, modern look with minimal hardware.

## Match Hardware to the Environment

Use glass clamps and handles in finishes that blend into tile or wall tones (e.g., brushed nickel with light stone). It keeps the eye from being distracted.

## Use Glass Shelves or Niche Panels

Clear glass shelves for products or accessories keep the design light and open.

## Extend the Shower Glass Closer to the Ceiling

This can make the ceiling appear higher and the room taller. Just make sure you have proper ventilation!

## Add Mirrors Strategically

Mirrors reflect both light and space—use them opposite windows or behind vanities to visually double the room.

## Choose Light Colors Around the Glass

Pair your glass with light or neutral tiles and wall colors. Bright, reflective materials boost the sense of space.
